2024 KEY SERVICES

KMOS-TV engaged with Missouri citizens in 38 counties through the broadcasts on four over-the air channels, a variety of local events, and the annual Young Writers' Contest. Citizens also take advantage of online video delivery through the local livestream of our primary channel (6.1) on a variety of platforms. These include the KMOS website, the PBS App, YouTube TV, Local Now and Hulu + Live. We look forward to adding platforms in the year to come. In addition to the livestream of the KMOS HD channel, KMOS provides locallyproduced programs to stream free on-demand through the PBS App, in addition to the thousands of hours distributed nationally.

LOCAL IMPACTS

With a broadcast signal that covers 178,000 TV households in a 20,000

square mile area, KMOS-TV connects residents with non-commercial and subscription-free information otherwise unavailable. Through these and the activities outlined on these pages, KMOS-TV continues to build relationships between and within the many communities in our large coverage area.

LOCAL PRESENTATIONS

Daily Blend with AC Premiere June 21, 2024 - From the producers of *Radio Friends with Paul Pepper*, KMOS presents this new weekly program, a selection of conversations recorded during the week and aired on KBIA-FM. Host Adonica Coleman visits with guests from the region who have deep connections with the arts, civic life, health, finance, technology, community building and more.

Mun Choi – The Story July 2023 - Currently the president of the University of Missouri, Mun Y. Choi shares his life story. At the age of nine he came with his parents to the United States from South Korea, then grew up in Akron, Ohio and Chicago, Illinois.

Missouri Artisans: A Making Special November 2023 - We celebrate our state by traveling across Missouri to highlight some of the most talented makers and artists we could find. These include makers of wooden toys and games, useful objects made of natural materials, stunning and practical pottery, bee by-products, wearable art, nature-themed porcelain pottery, Ozark-made fruitcakes, and Missouri wines.

2023 Mid-America Regional Emmy[®] **Award** - In the Fall of 2023 KMOS producers were honored with an award from the Mid-American Chapter of the National Association of Television Arts & Sciences (NATAS) for an episode of the series *Making*. Producers Christy Millen, Roy Millen and Tim Oar crafted three seasons of the series which profiles artisans, craftspeople and their talents. The award-winning story was on the Missouri School of Blacksmithing.

Bank of America *Celebration at the Station* July 4, 2023 - Produced by Kansas City PBS and made available to KMOS, this annual concert is a favorite among our viewers. Music Director Michael Stern lead the Kansas City Symphony in a concert featuring a rock band primarily composed of severely wounded U.S. combat veterans. The Kansas City Symphony also performed iconic patriotic works by John Williams, Aaron Copland and John Phillip Sousa.

Marching Mizzou appears in the Dublin St. Patrick's Festival Parade March 17, 2024 - Marching Mizzou appeared on the Create Channel (KMOS 6.2) which airs on public television stations nationwide. The St. Patrick's Festival Parade was hosted by Irish TV presenter Francis Brennan and Create TV host Mickela Mallozzi.

WORKS IN PROGRESS

In 2024 KMOS producers began work on various projects including a series of programs that profile various businesses and organizations in west-central Missouri. These include Powell Gardens and RISE in Warrensburg.

In addition, KMOS is currently working on a documentary exploring personal stories behind the epidemic of deaths linked to use of the synthetic opioid fentanyl. With an anticipated premiere in the spring of 2025, this documentary will be crafted from interviews with 18 family members directly impacted by the drug as well as medical professionals and addiction experts. In creating the program, KMOS crew travelled 4,500 miles throughout Missouri, Kansas, and Illinois over a total of 19 field production days. The crew included three UCM production students who contributed their talents and gained invaluable experience in the process.

PRODUCTION STUDIO UPDATE

The KMOS production studio was updated for the first time since the station began operations in 1979. Renovations included a new lighting grid with LED instruments, multiple backdrop curtains, sound deadening panels, and a new computerized lighting system to replace the clunky breaker box. The last update to the studio was in the late 1980s with the addition of the curved wall. These enhancements allow for more flexibility and creativity by KMOS production staff and students as they move from one project to the next.

PBS News Special: CNN Presidential Debate Simulcast June 2024

PBS provided live coverage and analysis of the debate between former President Joe Biden and President Donald Trump. The broadcast began with a simulcast of The CNN Presidential Debate, followed by PBS News special coverage coanchored by Amna Nawaz and Geoff Bennett.

This Week in Missouri Politics: KMOS continued to partner with The Missouri Times to bring *This Week in Missouri Politics* to central Missouri. This program is produced by the Missouri Times and features local, state and federal lawmakers and opinion makers who shape the political landscape.

Daily Newscasts from Around the Globe

In addition, KMOS presents regular national and international news coverage and analysis on KMOS Emerge 6.3 through daily broadcasts from Japan (NHK), Germany (Deutsche Welle,) France (France 24), and Great Britain (BBC.) These are in broadcasts on KMOS 6.1 of PBS News, BBC News, Amanpour & Co, and Democracy Now!

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

KMOS works in partnership with organizations and agencies throughout the region to create community-based educational activities that support our low income, high needs families and those in rural areas of the KMOS market. Our outreach events provide opportunities for families to participate in fun-family oriented educational activities that promote learning – they are free of charge and open to the public.

AUGUST 2023: KMOS PBS engagement worked with civic and community organizations through virtual and in-person meetings to establish engagement opportunities and coordination for the coming months. Additionally, KMOS met and engaged with community members at the Missouri State Fair.

SEPTEMBER 2023: KMOS PBS took part in the annual 'Get The Red Out' block party event on the campus of the University of Central Missouri. KMOS PBS promoted PBS KIDS programing and PBS LearningMedia. KMOS worked with the Runge Conservation Nature Center in Jefferson City for a preview screening of the Ken Burns film 'The American Buffalo'.

October 2023: KMOS PBS hosted an Indie Lens Pop-Up event in Fulton, Missouri on the campus of William Woods University for the film 'A Town Called Victoria'. KMOS Community Engagement participated in the Business and Community Expo hosted by the Columbia Chamber of Commerce.

November 2023: KMOS PBS hosted an Indie Lens Pop-Up event in Jefferson City, Missouri at Capitol City Cinema for the film 'A Town Called Victoria'.

January 2024: KMOS PBS again launched the KMOS PBS KIDS Writers Contest in January of 2024. Outreach and engagement efforts focused on partnerships with teachers, teacher organizations along with general audiences. This year entries from children in fourth grade were also accepted. A total of 49 entries were received prior to the deadline. Winning entries were placed on the KMOS website, and the winners received Amazon Kindle tablets and books provided by Scholastic. This initiative was sponsored in part by Trails Regional Libraries and Missouri NEA.

Continuation of the Indie Lens Pop-Up Series occurred with film screenings at Capitol City Cinema and William Woods University in Fulton, and Jefferson City.

April 2024: KMOS PBS Engagement staff participated in ShowCase Como and other community events surrounding Earth Day to promote climate themed programming and provide resources to learn more about our changing environment and encourage utilization of resources for learning about climate change and our local habitats.


